When did you live in the Bay Area, and what brought you here?

My family has lived in the East Bay since the 1950's, and I grew up in Pleasant Hill. After I attended University in Santa Cruz in 2001, graduate school in New York, and spent two years living in Oregon, I returned to Oakland in 2010 and lived there until 2019. Much of my family still lives in the Bay Area.

What prompted you to leave?
